

### **FUNDRAISING INITIATIVES**

**COMMUNITY : WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMMES.** 

#### **1. PHENYLE MAKING**

Mothers of Day Care centre children prepare phenyle which is on sale for members and friends every month. A percentage of the profit is given to the mothers as their income.

YWCA of Bangalore City provides 60% of the profit to the mothers as making charges and retains 20% to purchase materials.



#### **2. MAKING OF PAPER BAGS**

The elderly women make paper bags – for sanitary disposal. These are on sale every month to our YWCA hostels and others outside. These women earn some income for making the bags that helps them buy small eatables, medicines, etc.

YWCA of Bangalore City provides them 80% as profit and retains only 20%.
